

Investing In Our Infrastructure

Soos Creek Water & Sewer District's (SCWSD) leadership team is tasked with looking at the "big picture" to manage water and sewer system assets and to recommend appropriate investment for continued system reliability. In 2021 and 2022, SCWSD was awarded Public Works Trust Fund (PWTF) loans for two critical water system projects. PWTF loans are low interest loans for public works projects. Securing low interest loans assists the District in making improvements to our aging infrastructure and helps keep water and sewer rates low.



1. Reservoir No. 6

Retrofit

Project Location: Near Petrovitsky Park

This project is focused on seismic risk. Reservoir No. 6 will be retrofitted with a larger concrete foundation and soil anchors penetrating the earth below the foundation to keep the Reservoir stable during an earthquake. Flexible connections will be added to the pipes that serve the Reservoir to keep the pipes from breaking should the earth shift. Two state of the art earthquake sensing systems will be installed to provide advance warning of earthquake activity and a control valve will protect the Reservoir from losing its stored water while still providing enough water for emergency response after a seismic event. The earthquake sensing systems are part of the U.S. Geological Survey Program that provides advance warning to many regional and local government agencies. Additional improvements include upgrades for District personnel safety while climbing the Reservoir and provisions to make upgrades to the water quality in the Reservoir. The project will begin in early 2023 and construction should last approximately 15 months. Customers served by our Reservoir No. 6 should not experience any service disruptions or notice any changes in their water service.

2. Boulevard Lane

Replacement of Water Pipes, Service Lines, and Hydrants

Project Location:

Boulevard Lane neighborhood, between SE 192nd St. and SE 184th Pl. and 126th Pl. SE and 134th Ave. SE

In mid-2023, the District expects to begin replacing the aged water pipes, service lines, and hydrants in the Boulevard Lane neighborhood. New water pipes and services will be provided for 145 customers. The project improves the reliability of water service, water quality, and fire flow. This is Phase 2 of a project completed near this neighborhood in



2021. Customers in the area may experience some temporary inconveniences due to construction activity but emergency services, mail delivery and access to the residents' homes will be maintained during the project. The District will provide an ongoing public outreach program before and during all construction activities to assist in minimizing disruptions and impacts to our customers.

Soos Creek's Water & Sewer Rates - 2023

Our water and sewer rates are among the lowest in the region

* Summer conservation rates include a 20% surcharge after 1,000 ccf, except irrigation

Soos Creek Water & Sewer District provides essential water and sewer services to residential and commercial customers safely, reliably, and at the lowest responsible rates. While it's always difficult to raise rates during uncertain economic times, rate increases are now necessary to support continued delivery of the utility services you rely upon.

On December 7, 2022, the Soos Creek Board of Commissioners approved an 8% increase in the monthly base charges and volume charges for water and 8% increase in the Soos Creek portion of sewer rates. For a residential customer, the bi-monthly increase to their water bill base rate would be \$2.63 and the sewer base rate would be \$3.40 in 2023. Please note that King County's sewage treatment rate is set by the King County Council, not by Soos Creek Water & Sewer District. The increases will be effective with the February 28, 2023 billing cycle.

Sewer Rates

The sewer bills sent to Soos Creek customers itemize the charges for Soos Creek's sewer rate and King County's Sewage Treatment charges. The District's portion of the bill is for the maintenance of our system which collects the sewage from your house, business, or school and conveys it to King County's system and ultimately to the King County South Treatment Plant in Renton. The King County Sewage Treatment charge reflects King County's capital and operating costs for treatment and disposal of sewage. Don't dump grease down the drain

- Use screens to keep hair, fruit stickers and other things out of drains and pipes.
- Scrape out greasy bowls, pots, and pans before washing.
- Keep fatty foods and meats out of the garbage disposal, and put cooled, solidified grease in the trash.

What happens when grease is washed down the drain?


When grease is washed down the drain, it sticks to the inside of sewer pipes (both on your property and in the streets). Over time, it builds up and can block an entire pipe. Garbage disposals do not keep grease out of the pipes, they only shred it into smaller pieces.

The results of a grease-blocked sewer pipe can be:

- Sewage overflows in your home or your neighbor's home
- The average cleanup cost is about \$3,000
- Possible contact with disease-causing organisms
- An increase in operation and maintenance costs by the local sewer district and King County, which causes higher sewer bills for customers.



Grease going down the drain can cause serious problems in our sewers and your house drains and pipes.


